Our facilities

The hall seats 60 in comfort.

When standing, capacity increases to 80.

It has a modern, well-equipped kitchen with a range cooker and oven. In addition, there is fridge and freezer storage, a dishwasher and sufficient plates, dishes and cups to serve 80 people.

The hall had a 5 star hygiene rating when it was the venue for the Luncheon Club.

Whether you are preparing or cooking your own food or making use of an outside caterer, our facilities make the hall an ideal location whether it's a celebration, fundraiser, social event or a club meeting.

Centenary of the hall

The hall was built in 1913 as a Reading Room. Its first committee was formed in January 1914 and the hall formally opened on the last day of January that year, with

Miss Beech performing the opening ceremony. It remained as a reading room for many years until the late sixties when it became a village hall. At the start of the millennium, funding was secured to update the hall with a modern kitchen, toilets and baby changing facilities being added along with a new floor, windows, electrics and the removal of a false ceiling. If anyone has photos of the hall in use from its opening until the Second World War we would love to see them.
