SHOW RULES

- 1. Exhibits must have been entirely grown on the allotment or garden by the exhibitor
- 2.Exhibitors will receive a number to distinguish their exhibits, the number to be placed on or against the articles staged. The entrance fee for each entry to be 5p.
- 3.The Judge or judges shall be appointed by the Committee and his or her decision shall be final.
- 4.Exhibitors may make as many entries as the wish in any class.
- 5.Two prizes to be given, providing there are 6 entries: 1 prize if less than 6, unless Judge consider outstanding merit necessitates a 2nd.
- 6.The Committee will not be responsible for loss or damage before or during the show. Plates and vases to be provided by the exhibitor.
- 7.All exhibitors to keep their allotted space in all classes at the Show, and all exhibits must be staged between 10 am and 2 pm on the day of the Show.
- 8.No exhibits to be moved or interfered with in anyway when once exhibited until after 6.00pm on the day of the Show.
- 9. The Committee Members will act as Stewards.
- 10. Any exhibitor lodging an objection against an exhibit at the Show shall deposit a sum of 50p with the Show Secretary, same to be refunded if the protest is justified. The decision of the Committee in all cases shall be final.
- 11. Points gained at the show will count 1st 3 points 2nd 2 points.
- 12. Any exhibitor, who, in the opinion of the committee has wilfully disobeyed the condition before mentioned, is liable to be expelled from the Show and prizes gained at the show will be forfeited.
- 13.All prizes must be claimed on the night of prize distribution or forfeited.
- 14.All entrants in all classes must be marked reserved otherwise they will be sold for Association funds.
- 14.In the event of more than one exhibitor gaining equal number of points for the Cup, the same shall be held by each member for an equal period of time.
- 16.Show Labels. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that each entry is identified by their own number.
- 17. Prize-giving to take place at 5.45pm, followed by auction of produce at 6.15pm.
- 18. All Cups to be signed for before leaving the show

These Show Rules were adopted by the Committee on 6th July 2015

All cups to be returned to the secretary by 1st August before the next show.
